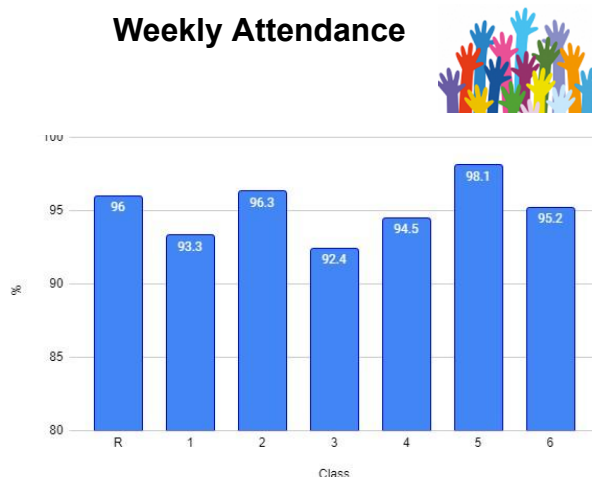

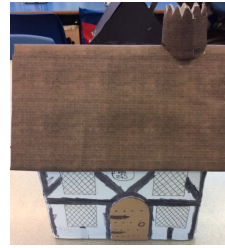
Congratulations Mrs Tweddle
