

This week is Deaf Awareness week and to mark this occasion we invited Zara Musker into school for a special assembly. Zara is a deaf athlete who plays Futsal for England. During her visit to Thorn Grove, Zara led an inspiring assembly to the whole school, where she shared with the children what it is like to be a member of Team England Deaf Women's Futsal, the challenges and highlights of her career, and her goals for the future. After the assembly, we organised for Zara to lead a workshop for our deaf children and their families. This was a wonderful experience for children to talk openly and honestly in a safe and secure environment. Zara said "I wish I had come to a school like this, I did not meet anyone who was deaf until the age of 15 so grew up not really understanding myself".



Coronation Day

After this, we learnt about the actual process of a Coronation and the six separate stages involved.
